Subject: Federal Benefits 2022 Cost-of-Living Adjustment (COLA)

Federal Benefits 2022 Cost-of-Living Adjustment (COLA)

Background

The Social Security Administration adjusts Retirement, Survivors and Disability Insurance (RSDI) benefits and Supplemental Security Income (SSI) benefits to reflect the annual cost-of-living adjustment (COLA) effective January 1st of each year. The COLA increase for 2022 is 5.9 percent.

Policy Updates

[Community Care Services Eligibility \(CCSE\) Income Limits](#)

Community Attendant Services (CAS), Family Care (FC), Emergency Response System (ERS), Day Activity and Health Services (DAHS), Assisted Living/Residential Care (AL/RC), Adult Foster Care (AFC), Special Services to Persons with Disabilities (SSPD) and Consumer Managed Personal Attendant Services (CMPAS)

The income limit is based on the special income limit set for institutional care which is equal to 300 percent of the SSI federal benefit rate. Effective January 1, 2022, the special income limits are as follows:

- Individual: \$2,523
- Couple: \$5,046

CAS

The 2022 resource limits are based on the SSI resource limits and will remain as follows:

- Individual: \$2,000
- Couple: \$3,000

FC, ERS, DAHS, AL/RC, AFC, SSPD, and CMPAS

The 2022 resource limits will remain as follows (CCSEH 3210 Resource Limits):

- Individual: \$5,000
- Couple: \$6,000

[Medicare Savings Program \(MSP\) Resource Limits](#)

The resource limits for Qualified Medicare Beneficiaries (QMB), Specified Low-Income Medicare Beneficiaries (SLMB), and Qualifying Individuals 1 (QI-1) are adjusted annually. Effective January 1, 2022, the resource limits for QMB, SLMB, and QI-1 are as follows:

- Individual: \$8,400
- Couple: \$12,600

The resource limits for the Qualified Disabled and Working Individuals (QDWI) program are twice the countable resources allowed under the SSI program and will remain the same:

- Individual: \$4,000
- Couple: \$6,000

MSP Income Limits

The MSP income limits are adjusted annually based on the federal poverty level (FPL). The income limits for QMB, SLMB and QI-1 will remain the same until the new FPL amounts are published in early 2022.

Federal Benefit Increases

Social Security - RSDI and SSI beneficiaries receive a 5.9 percent COLA increase effective January 1, 2022.

Effective January 1, 2022, the maximum SSI payment amount is as follows:

- Individual: \$841
- Couple: \$1,261

Medicare Part B

The standard Medicare Part B premium will increase to \$170.10 for 2022.

Automation

Automation changes are not required.

Correspondence

Correspondence changes are not required.

Handbook

The CCSE Handbook updates are scheduled for the March 2022 revision.

The CCSE Appendix XI is scheduled to be updated on the LOOP on December 10, 2021.

Training

Training is not required.

Effective Date

This COLA updates are effective January 1, 2022.
