### Community Mental Health Grant

#### Program Overview

The Community Mental Health Grant (CMHG) program supports comprehensive, data-driven mental health systems that promote both wellness and recovery. The program design fosters community collaboration, reduces duplication of services and strengthens continuity of care. CMHG's mental and behavioral health programming consists of five distinct service types: Access to Care, Co-occurring Disorders/Substance Use Disorder Services, Crisis and Forensic Services, Peer Support Services, and School-Based and Early Intervention Services.

## TEXAS-SIZED ACHIEVEMENTS

In fiscal year 2021, the CMHG program piloted an agency initiative to standardize performance measures of behavioral health programming. The three outcome achievements highlighted here represent inaugural grantee service metrics.



98% of participants with a history of hospitalization were prevented from immediate re-admission while enrolled in a CMHG-funded program.



77% of the 2,575 students showed improvement in behavior in an academic setting as an outcome of receiving services.



92% of participants were **not arrested** while enrolled in a CMHG-funded program.
