

What is the Primary Health Care Program?



We work to prevent, detect and treat health problems in Texans of all ages who don't qualify for other state or federal health care assistance programs.

The Primary Health Care Program offers services provided by physicians, physician assistants, or advanced practice nurses in a doctor's office, clinic, or facility other than a hospital. Services include:

- Diagnosis and treatment of common health concerns
- Emergency services
- Family planning services
- Preventative health services, including immunizations and screenings
- Health education
- Diagnostic testing, such as X-rays and lab services

Who is Eligible?

You might be eligible for services if you meet all the following requirements:

- Be a Texas resident
- Have an income level at or below 200% of the federal poverty guidelines
- Do not receive benefits from other programs that provide similar services

How Can I Find Services?

To receive program services, you must apply in person at a contracted clinic. Visit or call a clinic in your area to speak with staff who will determine if you qualify. You can locate a clinic at [211Texas.org](https://www.211Texas.org). Call your preferred clinic to ask what eligibility documents to bring to the clinic visit.
