Office of Women's Health and Education Services Contracts

- **Healthy Texas Women (HTW):**
 - Approximately \$18 million in awards
 - 39 contractors representing 201 clinic sites
- **Family Planning Program (FPP):**
 - Approximately \$44.8 million in awards
 - 53 contractors representing 258 clinic sites
- **Breast and Cervical Cancer Services (BCCS):**
 - Approximately \$10.6 million in awards
 - 38 contractors representing 230 clinic sites



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Office of Women's Health and Education Services Contracts

- Two year contract renewals currently in progress
- Contractors are receiving same level funding until appropriations are final
- Contracts must be executed by September 1, 2017

Zika Benefit

Coverage Start Date: May 1, 2017

- **Who is covered:** Pregnant women of any age, women and girls ages 10-55, and males 14 and older, as applicable, in the following programs:
 - Medicaid
 - Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP)
 - CHIP Perinatal
 - Healthy Texas Women
 - Children with Special Health Care Needs (CSHCN)
 - Family Planning Program



Zika Benefit (cont.)

HTW Fee-For-Service Benefit:

- Clients can pick up mosquito repellent without a prescription from many pharmacies that participate in the Vendor Drug Program (VDP).
- Clients should contact a pharmacy ahead of time to see if they are providing the benefit.
- Clients can go to www.txvendordrug.com to find a pharmacy's location and phone number.



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Zika Benefit (cont.)

HTW and FPP Cost Reimbursement Benefit:

- Contractors who think they may have a remaining balance in their categorical award at the end of the fiscal year are highly encouraged to take the opportunity to purchase Zika-related supplies for their HTW and FPP clients.



Zika Benefit (cont.)

HTW and FPP Cost Reimbursement Benefit:

- Supplies that may be purchased with these funds for distribution to HTW and FPP clients include: insect repellent, condoms, and insect netting.

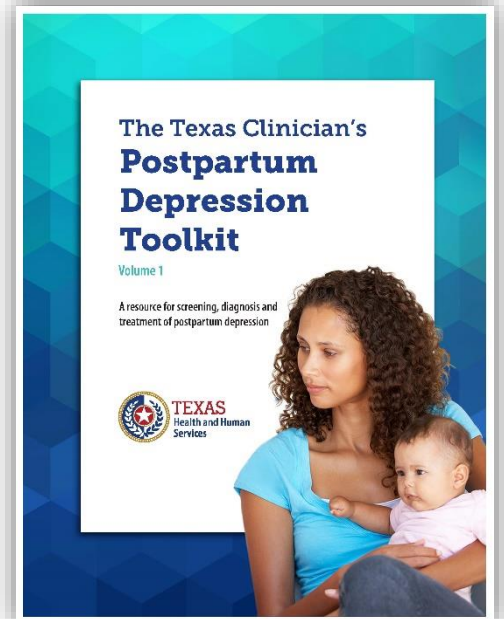

- **169,361** total estimated clients enrolled for March 2017
- **82.1%** increase in enrollment

²In FY 2016, HHSC changed methodologies to ensure total client counts are unduplicated across and within programs, with the exception of the Breast and Cervical Cancer Services Program which may contain clients also counted in other programs due to the program nature.

³Family Planning changed to a new program in August 2016, as the new Healthy Texas Women Program was implemented, however eligibility remained the same.

⁴Expanded Primary Health Care (EPHC) began in FY 2014, and ended August 2016, as the new Healthy Texas Women Program began.

⁵Women's Health was a Medicaid program, and became fully-state funded as Texas Women's Health Program January 2013. It ended June 2016.

⁶Healthy Texas Women began July 2016, as a combination of EPHC and TWHP. It is an enrollment-based program, with a 12-month term of coverage.

⁷Total Clients include both average enrollment (for WHP/TWHP and HTW only) and the total number served. Current data utilizes a methodology that provides unduplicated counts.
