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# Children's Mental Health Strategic Plan: Rider Requirement (1 of 2)

2024-2025 General Appropriations Act, House Bill 1, 88th Legislature, Regular Session, 2023 [Article IX, Section 10.04(g)], requires the Statewide Behavioral Health Coordinating Council (SBHCC) to:

- Develop a strategic plan specific to the behavioral health of children and youth.
- The plan must incorporate the full continuum of care needed to support children and families to include the following:
  - Descriptions of who provides what services to which children;
  - Strategies to identify and address gaps in care;
  - Discussion of workforce shortages;
  - Information on funding and reimbursement; and
  - Children-specific data and expenditure information.

# Children's Mental Health Strategic Plan: Rider Requirement (2 of 2)

- The SBHCC shall develop a subcommittee to draft the strategic plan, minimally comprised of the following:
  - The Health and Human Services Commission;
  - Department of State Health Services;
  - Department of Family and Protective Services;
  - Texas Education Agency;
  - Texas Juvenile Justice Department; and
  - Medical practitioners with expertise and facilities which provide inpatient and outpatient care.
- The plan is due to the Legislative Budget Board and Governor's Office by December 1, 2024.

#### Children's Mental Health Strategic Plan: Behavioral Health Advisory Committee Questions and Comments

- During the May 5, 2023, Behavioral Health Advisory Committee meeting, members posed the following questions and comments for consideration:
  - Q1: Will transition-aged youth be considered in the plan?
  - Q2: Will substance use services be included in the plan?
  - Recommendation: Ensure the voices of people with lived experience and organizations providing peer and recovery supports are represented.

#### Children's Mental Health Strategic Plan: Behavioral Health Advisory Committee Answers

- Q1 Response: The covered age range will be birth through age 17.
- Q2 Response: Yes. Though the rider is titled *Children's Mental Health Strategic Plan*, it directs that the plan is specific to the behavioral health of children and youth. Behavioral health is inclusive of mental health and substance use disorders, services, and supports.
- Recommendation: The following organizations representing the perspectives of people with lived experience or providing peer and recovery supports have been invited to serve on the subcommittee:
  - Local Mental Health Authorities and Local Behavioral Health Authorities;
  - National Alliance on Mental Illness Texas;
  - The Center for Young Minds;
  - Lifeworks; and
  - Texas Family Voice Network.
