Since May 2022, HHSC has:

- Hosted a third webinar with CPW providers
- Hosted an informational session for DSHS Division for Regional and Local Health Operations, Specialized Health and Social Services (SHSS) staff
- Hosted two joint calls with CPW providers and MCOs
- Hosted two joint calls with DSHS SHSS staff and MCOs

- Exchanged data and case files with MCOs
- Began readiness activities with MCOs
- Continued monitoring of CPW provider contracting and credentialing

Post Implementation Activities

HHSC will implement the following activities after September 1, 2022:

- Continue monthly monitoring of contracting and credentialing status of STPs for each MCO
- New monthly CPW encounters report
- Monitor CPW-related member and provider complaints received by HHSC and MCOs
- New quarterly MCO CPW reporting



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Next Steps

Next Steps

- Obtain CMS approval of 1115 Transformation Waiver amendment
- Continue hosting bi-weekly transition calls with Medicaid MCOs after September 1, 2022
- Continue to coordinate with DSHS
- Monitor continuity of care during the transition
- Complete MCO readiness activities before September 1, 2022
- Start post implementation activities
- Continue assisting and receiving questions from CPW providers
