

Children with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) can receive long-term care services through both an IDD waiver program and the STAR Kids program or the STAR Health program. When this happens, parents or legally authorized representatives work with a team of service coordinators to ensure your child gets the services they need from each program.

Managed care organization (MCO) service coordinators and IDD waiver service coordinators will communicate with each other and parents or legally authorized representatives to develop a plan that meets your child's needs.

## IDD Waiver Programs, STAR Kids or STAR Health, and Long-Term Services and Supports

IDD waiver programs provide services to people with IDD or multiple disabilities to help them live at home or in the community instead of in a facility. There are four IDD waiver programs in Texas:

- Community Living Assistance and Support Services (CLASS)
- Deaf Blind with Multiple Disabilities (DBMD)
- Home and Community-based Services (HCS)
- Texas Home Living (TxHmL)

IDD waiver programs provide long-term services and supports, including:

- Community First Choice Personal Attendant Services and Habilitation (CFC PAS/HAB).
- Minor home modifications.
- Respite.
- Nonmedical transportation to community-based activities.


STAR Kids and STAR Health are Medicaid programs for children and young adults with disabilities. STAR Kids and STAR Health

services are managed by health plans and include health care and long-term care services such as:

- Regular checkups to the doctor and dentist.
- Prescription drugs and vaccines.
- Physical, occupational and speech therapy.
- Durable medical equipment.
- Nursing and private duty nursing.

STAR Kids or STAR Health and the IDD waiver programs can provide many of the same long-term services and supports. If your child needs a service available in both STAR Kids or STAR Health and an IDD waiver program, they must get the service through STAR Kids or STAR Health.

Nursing is provided through both STAR Kids or STAR Health and the IDD waiver. STAR Kids and STAR Health can provide ongoing direct nursing care for your child's medical needs, while IDD waiver programs can provide a few hours for an initial assessment and care coordination.



Attendant services are provided through both STAR Kids or STAR Health and the IDD waiver. Since your child receives IDD waiver services, they must receive CFC PAS/HAB through their IDD waiver provider.

#### Your Child's Service Plan

Your child's STAR Kids or STAR Health service coordinator and IDD waiver service coordinator work together to identify resources and ensure your child gets the services they need through the appropriate resources. The IDD waiver service coordinator is responsible for keeping a comprehensive service plan that includes all waiver and STAR Kids or STAR Health services. Depending on your child's waiver program, the IDD waiver service coordinator may be called a case manager.

The STAR Kids or STAR Health service coordinator and IDD waiver service coordinator will both work with you to create, update and implement a service plan that addresses your child's unique needs and preferences:

- Each program's service plan will list which services will be provided through STAR Kids or STAR Health and which will be provided through the IDD waiver.
- Your child's service coordinators will explain all the services offered by each program and how they help your child.

#### Who Should I Contact About My Child's Services?

Contact your child's STAR Kids or STAR Health service coordinator any time you have questions about the program's services or acute care services. Contact your child's IDD waiver service coordinator any time you have questions about IDD waiver services or other non-waiver services. You should also contact them when:

- A service needs to be added to your child's service plan.
- The amount of a service your child receives needs to be adjusted.
- There's a change in your child's health status.

If you have a concern, first go through either the STAR Kids or STAR Health managed care organization or IDD waiver complaint resolution process. If your concern is not resolved, see the table on next page.
