

Statewide Opioid Coordination

- The Statewide Opioid Coordination section and TTOR works in coordination with the Opioid Abatement Council (OFAC).
- Opioid Settlement Funded Grants to Date:
 - ▶ \$25 Million for Naloxone distribution (Funded)
 - ▶ \$25 Million for K-12 Educational prevention program to address and reduce misuse among students. Applications due by Nov 2 by 2PM.
 - ▶ Released RFI for Peer-to-Peer workforce enhancement program.
- Tracks federal funds coming into Texas to address the opioid epidemic
- Develops the National Statewide Opioid Coordinator network to coordinate and provide assistance to address the opioid crisis nationwide

Program Overview

The Texas Targeted Opioid Response (TTOR) program addresses the opioid crisis with strategies spanning the behavioral health continuum of care, coordinating prevention, integrated, treatment, and recovery services across the state. In fiscal year 2023, the TTOR program received support from the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administrations (SAMHSA) State Opioid Response (SOR) 2020 and 2022 grants, the Substance Use Prevention, Treatment, and Recovery Services (SUPTRS) Block Grant, and the 2021 Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (H.R. 133).

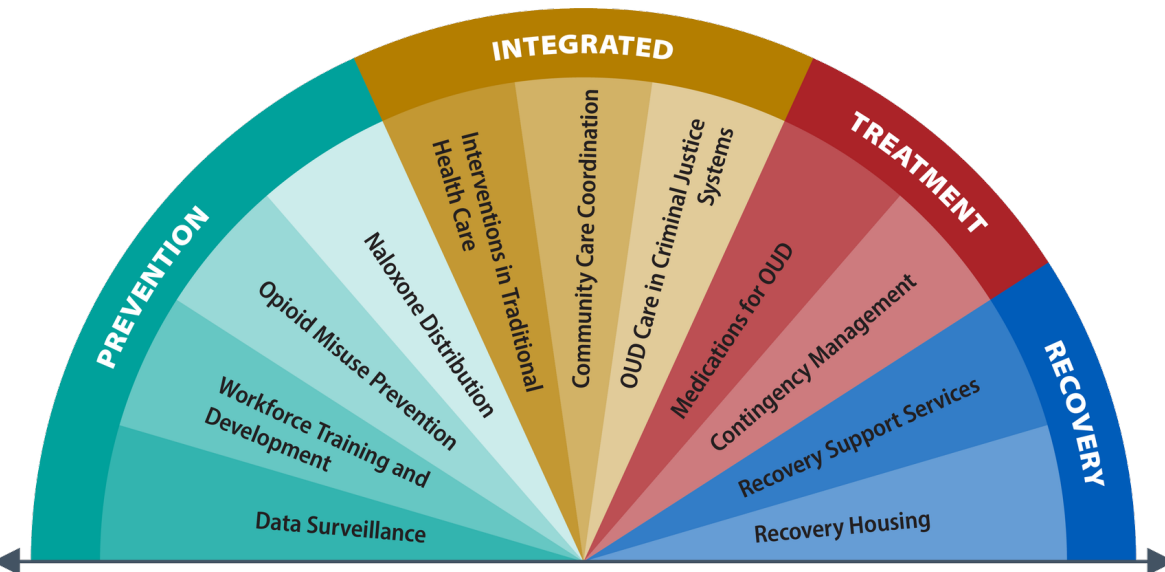

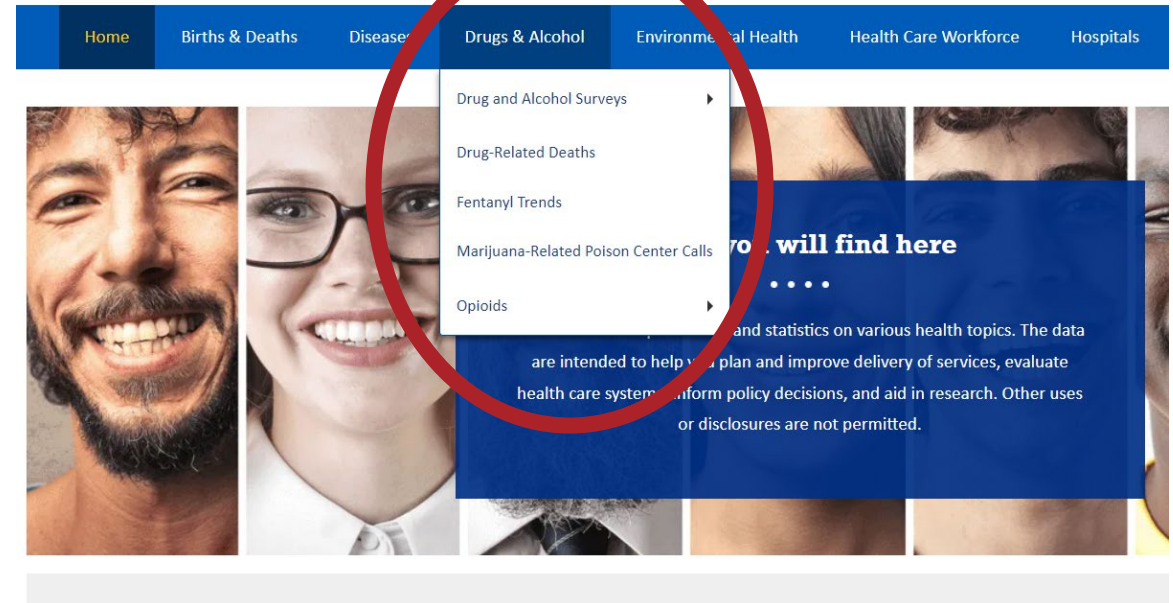
