

What is the Title V Maternal & Child Health Fee-for-Service Program?



We provide services to low-income women, children and adolescents who are not eligible for other health care assistance programs.

Services for Women

Prenatal and postpartum medical services are available for women during and up to 90 days after pregnancy. These services include:

- Complete history, physical exam and clinical assessment
- Family planning
- Counseling, education and referrals
- Routine prenatal laboratory and diagnostic testing
- Case management as needed

Dental services are available for women during and up to 90 days after pregnancy. These services include:

- Comprehensive and periodic oral evaluations
- Radiographs
- Preventative and therapeutic services
- Dental education and counseling

Services for Children and Adolescents

Medical and dental services are available for children and adolescents age 21 and younger. These services include:

- Well-child checkups
- Laboratory services
- Vaccinations
- Minimal sick care
- Case management as needed
- Education and counseling
- Comprehensive and periodic oral evaluations
- Radiographs
- Fluoride treatment
- Restorative treatment
- Sealant application

Who is Eligible?

You might be eligible for services if you're a Texas resident, have an income at or below 185% of the federal poverty guidelines, and do not receive benefits from other programs that provide the same services, including while waiting on Medicaid or CHIP eligibility.

How Can I Find Services?

To receive program services, you must apply in person at a contracted clinic. Visit or call a clinic in your area to speak with staff who will determine if you qualify. You can locate a clinic at [211Texas.org](https://www.211Texas.org). Call your preferred clinic to ask what eligibility documents to bring with you to the clinic visit.
