

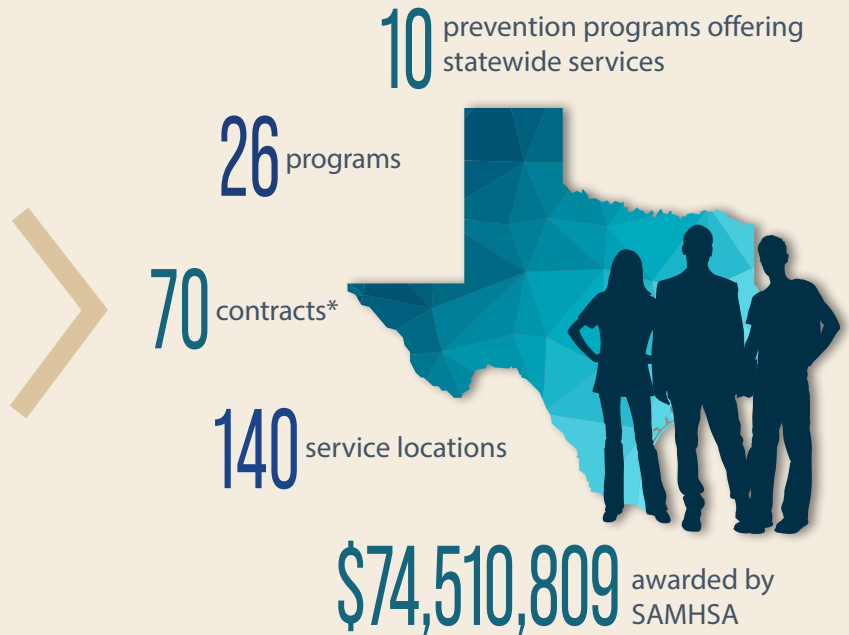

Texas Targeted Opioid Response

Program Overview

The Texas Targeted Opioid Response (TTOR) program aims to address the opioid crisis with strategies spanning the behavioral health continuum of care—coordinating prevention, integrated, treatment and recovery services across the state. In fiscal year 2022, the TTOR program was supported by the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration's (SAMHSA's) State Opioid Response 2020 grant.

lives saved

50,207
Naloxone kits distributed

4,879 participants received direct recovery support

430 people were admitted to MOUD treatment through the help of their recovery coach

73.5% people receiving state-funded treatment for an opioid use disorder (OUD) received evidence-based medications for OUD (MOUD)



51.3% people in MOUD treatment had a length of stay more than one year

1,930 people entered MOUD treatment through nontraditional settings from TTOR integrated programs

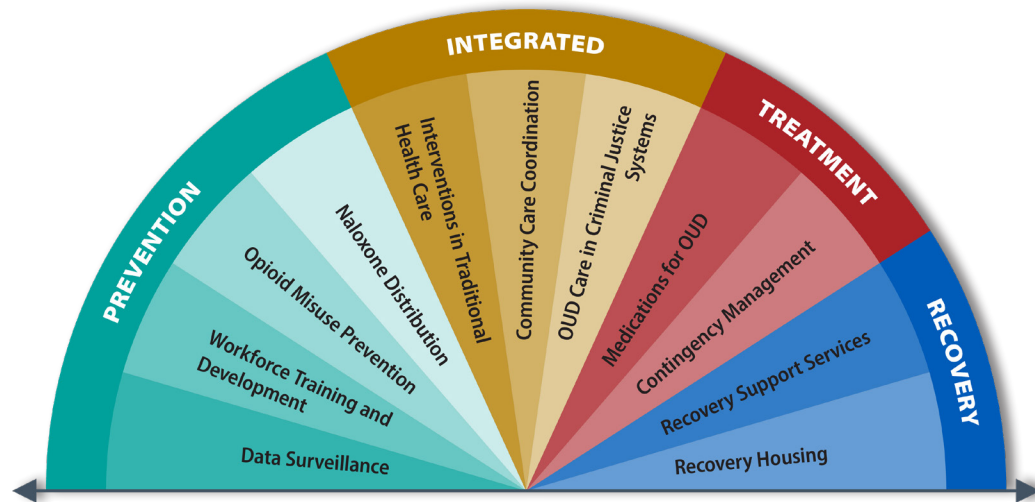
