Texas Targeted Opioid Response

Program Overview

The Texas Targeted Opioid Response (TTOR) program addresses the opioid crisis with strategies spanning the behavioral health continuum of care, coordinating prevention, integrated, treatment, and recovery services across the state. In fiscal year 2023, the TTOR program received support from the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administrations (SAMHSAs) State Opioid Response (SOR) 2020 and 2022 grants, the Substance Use Prevention, Treatment, and Recovery Services (SUPTRS) Block Grant, and the 2021 Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (H.R. 133).

128,095 Naloxone kits distributed

4,879 people received direct recovery support

people were admitted to evidence-based, medications for opioid use disorder (MOUD) treatment through the help of their recovery coach

73.10/ people received s MOUD treatment people received state-funded



54.8% people in MOUD treatment had a length of stay more than one year

2,693 people entered MOUD treatment through nontraditional settings from TTOR integrated programs



55,075,232 media impressions for the Opioid Awareness Campaign


